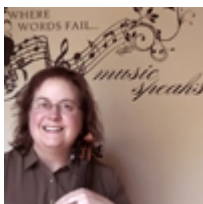

The Senior recital has been scheduled for May 16 at St. Antony's Episcopal church. However, considering the status of current events, May 16 may not be a date for gathering. We are currently working on an alternate plan, likely to involve video submissions or similar online approach. Please send in your senior information, as it will help us to decide how best to proceed.

Carnival Update

Good morning KMTA friends. As you know, our Music Carnival, scheduled for April 25, has been cancelled and Plan B is in full swing. Tests and answer keys have been printed and are in the process of being organized into packets for each teacher. Ribbons are expected to arrive April 10th. These tests and corresponding ribbons then will be organized into studios and be available for pick up by April 13, or be mailed by April 15. Attend our online Zoom membership meeting on April 10th at 11 am for more information and an opportunity to ask questions.

Your role in the testing process--what you can expect:

Upon receipt of your tests and ribbons, begin testing. You will need to decide how you wish to do testing - in person, remotely, or a combination. We ask that testing is completed by May 8. You will have answer keys for tests with the exception of theory tests. Please score tests using the answer keys and return ALL tests and keys to me, Diane Layton – 8295 Saddle Trail NW, Bremerton, WA 98311, by May 15. At this time we do still have a general meeting scheduled for May 8, so you may want to consider wrapping things up to return tests etc. to me at that meeting. Certificates and seals will be mailed by May 22, or you may pick them up from me at my home.

We will not be including answer keys for the theory tests. These scores are the only scores that the state looks at and in order to preserve the integrity of the test results and provide consistent scoring, we have decided that Diane and Dianne will do all theory test scoring.

Because this is an evolving situation, this plan is not carved in stone. As more changes and details develop we'll keep you posted, especially if it involves further changes to our newest plan. We encourage you to see this crisis as an opportunity to be creative within your studio and to learn. Try new ideas or learn new techniques (like how to do remote teaching!) Most importantly, practice grace. We all need a lot of grace right now, teachers and students alike. With a positive attitude we can get through this AND come out of it with more knowledge, strength and compassion for ourselves, our students, and their families.

Audio settings for music lessons using Zoom

If you are using Zoom for your online music lessons, here is a tip that GREATLY improves the sound quality!

Built into Zoom is an audio enhancement feature that reduces background noise, cancels echo, and utilizes a particular audio codec meant more for spoken voice rather than the dynamic nature of music. This feature is on by default, and though it's excellent for regular conference calls, it adversely affects the quality of the sound of a musical instrument over the Zoom call.

The two main settings we need to change are:

- disable the audio enhancements and enable the original sound of the microphone.
- disable automatic volume control so that the dynamics in the music come through.

Teacher and Student need to make these changes at both ends of the call for maximum benefit.

Note that this feature — preserving original sound — is not supported on phones and tablets, so teachers and students should both be using a laptop for online music lessons if at all possible.
