Unfortunately, that information only made it to the members who were directly involved, so we apologize to anyone who was unaware of the change!



KMTA Paypal Payments and Reimbursements Update

In March as KMTA was receiving your payments for MAP fees and competitions, we ran into a significant hitch with our Paypal account. Because KMTA does not process high volumes of payments every month, Paypal locked down our account as "high risk" for having "unusual activity," which meant that any funds received over a certain amount could have been retained by Paypal for up to 6 months. Fortunately we were able to withdraw the funds already in the account, and switched to by-check payments for the rest of the month.

Because there is no viable customer-service access to dispute any of Paypal's arbitrary decisions, KMTA will not be using Paypal anymore to receive credit card or bank-transfer payments. For the time being, we will need to go back to using checks for payments to KMTA. They can be handed to Treasurer Jane Melin or other Board officers at events; or mailed to Jane at: KMTA, P.O. Box 1012, Kingston WA 98346.

KMTA can still use Paypal to send out reimbursements or conference stipends if preferred by the recipient, since this does not risk money being frozen in our account. KMTA can also use Kitsap Bank's bill-payment service to transfer funds directly and securely to a recipient's bank account. Jane will contact you about your preference in advance. You can also be paid by check, mailed out by Kitsap Bank.
